## **East Side Water Project**

The East Side Water Project is complete. The project included new larger gutters and down spouts, larger inground pipes to each downspout leading to additional storm drains, an additional drain inside the gym at the outside door, and two new larger sump pumps for the footing tile drains and new gym drain. This new system will collect the stormwater that falls on the east side of the building and the adjacent grounds and transport it to the city storm water system. The cost for the project was \$ 80,000 and within budget.

#### SUMMARY OF OCTOBER 25, 2022 MEETING OF SESSION

THIS SUMMARY IS NOT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING.

#### Summary of October 25, 2022 Meeting of Session (not the minutes)

Session of First Presbyterian Church of Lee's Summit held its regular meeting on October 25 in the Center Room. Moderator, Rev. Alex Wales called the meeting to order by praying the Breakthrough Prayer in unison.

September Financials:	For the Month	Year to Date	Year to Date Budget

Cash in bank: \$88,489 (Current Liabilities \$17,102 = Net Available \$71,387)			

September income was above budget with pledged and non-pledged donations 125.7% of monthly budget. Year to date income is only \$2,713 below budgeted. Unfortunately, expenses were \$2,897 more than income for the month bringing overall DEFICIT to \$22,048 for the year.

**Budget for 2023**: Reviewed actual operating expenses compared to budgets for 2019, 2020, 2021 and YTD actuals to the budget for 2022 looking for trends. Also reviewed the current Raymond James Investment accounts compared to the beginning of the year and how the market losses will impact the 2023 budget. Then began a line by line review of expected income and expenses for 2023. Based on past experience we agreed to budget \$360,000 for pledges and will monitor it based on pledges that come in over the next 2 weeks. We reduced Per Capita expectations from \$8,500 to \$7,000 based on trends BUT, agreed to make a major push for more Per Capita in 2023 and to add Per Capita to pledge cards in 2023. Logos income and Interest Income should not be part of the Operating budget. For Expenses we agreed to ONLY budget for the "required" items and Action Team budgets would be \$0 for non-essentials. For General Mission we agreed to \$0 but we will review our budget quarterly and send funds to General Mission when available. Bottom line indicates we planned for a \$34,925 deficit budget.

**Communion:** Rev. Wales discussed communion by intinction indicating it is not healthy due to Covid and now flu season. We agreed we should serve bread and juice as individual items at the 9:00AM Contemporary service. We will also consider drinking the juice when given and eat the bread together. The Worship Action Team will adjust and update communion procedures.

**Congregational Meeting:** Blended Service on November 20 at 10:00AM followed by Congregational meeting and then Hanging of the Greens.

Next Stated meeting is November 15, 2022.
